The Shodhyatra was organized from 2 to 8th June 2008 by SRISTI, Ahmedabad and Honeybee AP, Hyderabad and supported by NIF, and other local partners viz. TERDS, SAMTA and Adivasi Mitra. It started from Borra and ended in Peddagurvu village in Vizag district of Andhra Pradesh. The Shodhyatra was led by Prof Anil K Gupta, Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad. Nearly seventy people from different walks of life together covered a distance close to hundred kilometers over a period of six days. These included farmers, innovators, students, professionals, artisans, voluntary organization workers, etc. from Gujarat, Maharashtra, Tamilnadu, Karnataka, West Bengal, Jammu & Kashmir, Orissa, Delhi, and Andhra Pradesh in addition people from USA and France also joined this "Shodhyatra" and shared their knowledge with each other.

The region, inhabited by economically poor tribal people, was found to be extremely rich in knowledge. But then market and state have no use for this knowledge, hence deprivation, distress and discontent! Naxalite movement is very strong here and given the economic and social indifference shown by the state, it is not surprising. Mining industry tried to exploit the mineral resources and the local tribals were given no stake in it. The local social organizations like Samta and Terds protested against it and got a stay from highest court against the decision of the state to handover the resources to large corporations without the consent and involvement of the tribals. This region, rich in jackfruits, local nutritiously rich millets, vegetative dyes and herbal pest repellents etc., could be an important source of sustainable technologies that could be distributed in horizontal market (that is from one village to another) and also vertical markets (that is we buy the products made by them). SRISTI plans to invite some of the local tribal communities in this year's Sattvik, the traditional food festival being organized in December at IIMA to puff their nutritiously rich food made of organic materials.

Generally in all the meetings at various villages Prof. A.K. Gupta briefed about the purpose of Shodhyatra and stressed on the importance of the documentation of traditional knowledge before it gets completely lost over a period of time. We also gave a register in each village to elder people or school teacher for documentation of

traditional knowledge and making the village knowledge register. We also gave away kits (globe, register etc.) for schools in some villages. Various posters were put up to explain innovations and in the evenings innovation videos were shown to the villagers. Throughout, Brig. Ganesham, coordinator honeybee AP briefed the discussions in telugu along with Mr. Chitti Babu, TERDS, Vizag to the gathering.

The credit for the successful completion of the SY goes to the respective organizations namely TERDS, SAMTA, Adivasi Mitra and especially to Brig. Ganesham , who held all the strings tightly together. The partner organizations were organising such an activity for the first time and despite certain errors (which are in any case expected), put up a good show. A lot of thanks is due to them for understanding the mission of HBN and supporting it too. A special mention is also being made of Mr. Chitti Babu, Setty Nageswar, Kammya, TERDS, Vasant Kumar, Adivasi Mitra for their constant support. The help provided by Mr. Rajeshwar Rao, Matrix biotech, Hyderabad in logistics is also appreciable. Although Jayendra and Bharat got little time to scout but managed well with the help of Pavan, Srinivas and Sudhakar who worked hard on the route despite various problems.
